Chapter Increases Philanthropy Donations, Community Service Hours, and Intramural Wins

Epsilon Eta has made great strides this past year. This past October, we held our annual Delt Draft, which is a week long military themed event aimed at raising money for the Wounded Warrior Project. Each day provided its own military themed event. We sold t-shirts, solicited donations, and sold ads to local businesses, and through this, we were able to donate \$1,000.00 dollars.

In the spring, we participated in the University's Relay for Life hosted behind Whitley Hall. As a chapter, we sold balloons for release during the event, as well as, brisket sandwiches. The Chapter would like to personally thank brother Tony Aguilar for the work that he did helping us reach our goal. Collectively, we were able to raise over \$1,100.00 dollars, and were awarded the best food at the event and up-and-coming organization. For philanthropy, Delta Tau Delta ranks number one amongst all IFC fraternities.

Community service is another thing that we have taken seriously over the course of the past year. We worked together with the local Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation organizations (JDRF is our National Philanthropy), Student Veterans Association, and several other organizations, which helped us complete over 330 community service hours as a chapter. This ranks Delta Tau Delta at number 2 out of ALL Greek Life, second to only Kappa Delta Chi (Multicultural Sorority).

We have also experienced a lot of success this past spring within intramurals winning softball, sand volleyball (CRUSHING THREE DIFFERENT Pi Kappa Alpha squads), placed third in basketball, and doing very well in many smaller intramural events.

The last bit of news is our academics. Epsilon Eta has enacted a totally

Rock's Words of Wisdom

You Were Always On My Mind

Brothers,

Last night I received a phone call saying that one of my pledge brothers, Jimmy Cooper, was very ill and had cancer. I have only seen Jimmy a few times since we graduated from East Texas State, but I have talked “about” him many times in Sociology classes in regards to viewpoints and perspective.

When I first saw Jimmy in the fall of 1961, he was wearing his High School letter jacket that was covered with all kinds of special decals that indicated he played multi sports and had lettered multiple times. Then finding out that he was valedictorian of his class was awe inspiring. Here was a great athlete that was brilliant. Viewing that letter jacket (I had lettered in football three times at Dallas Adamson) and knowing my academic endeavors and his academics, it was very impressive. Then he took me to his hometown (Roxton) and my viewpoint changed or my paradigm shifted.

Roxton was a small high school with less than 10 graduates in 1961 and was very different than a graduating class of 350 in the Oak cliff area of Dallas.

Jimmy has always been on my mind indirectly and hearing the news last night, he is in my thoughts even more. It has been 51 years since we took the Delt Oath together at ET.

The fraternity and the experience and friendship it offers is a very complex organization. The reality is that in any chapter there is a core group that really understands “it”, another group that has moments that they understand “it”, and an outer group that is just passing through.

Today you are being asked to support the enhancement of the shelter, to give money so that the opportunity to have a brotherhood (leadership development) is passed on to another group of students that are becoming who they will be.

I was in another city the other day, asking a graduate (a very successful business man) to give a financial gift (1 million plus) to the university to help students realize their educational dreams.

As we left his country club, he stopped on the porch and said “What would I have become without East Texas State College and the support it gave me”?

So I ask you the same question to you, “What would you be without the help of the university and the brotherhood of DTD”?

Dr. Cliff Wood in his speech accepting the Distinguished Alumni citation from the university, made references to his teachers and classes but noted that his leadership skills were developed in the DTD shelter.

Here is my check and I know that I will never have enough money to pay the debt of a life that has been good to my family and provide lifelong friendships.

I know when I go to my grave, some of the same guys I laughed, played sports with, went to class with, had arguments with, studied with, played poker with, double dated with, in G-1 with, someday will be carrying me home to chapter eternal.

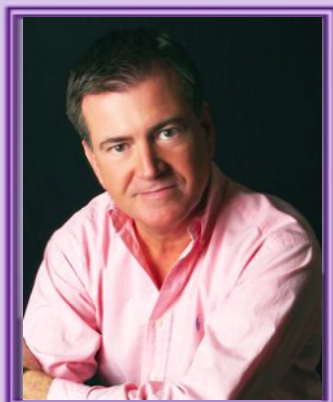

responsible for the usual stuff—mowing the yard, taking out the trash, running errands, etc. I was never really responsible 'for' other people. The fraternity changed all that." By being the social chairman, the rush chairman, and eventually the chapter president, Epsilon Eta provided Rene' with the opportunity to learn the necessary skills and techniques which allow him to run his successful business, The Texas Book Company.

As an undergraduate, some of Rene's favorite Delt moments were the mixers, parties, going undefeated for three consecutive years in volleyball, being thrown into the Driftwood Terrace pool after being elected president, and planning and executing Delt Relays. All of these are great memories that contribute to the man he is today, and remain the driving force for why he gives back to this day. "I would not be who I am without my experiences as a Delt. Digging deeper, I think back to a time shortly after I left. The Chapter got down to 8 guys, and Rock Clinton stepped in, and made sure that the Chapter survived. The reason I give back is because there is no way I can sit back and let the work of Rock and those 8 guys disappear." Today, Rene' calls Heath, Tx his home, and runs his extremely successful business out of Greenville, Tx. He is excited about the future of Epsilon Eta, and especially excited about the capital campaign to fully renovate the Delt Shelter.
