




Annual BS Open Big Success

Life without ΔΤΔ?

Have you ever wondered what college life would be like if you had not been a Delt? What about the acquaintances you've made within your own community because of ΔΤΔ? Has being a Greek benefited you?

I've often asked myself these questions and many others before and after graduation. Being a Delt was just what I wanted. During one of my earliest visits to the Shelter (old G-1) I was awed as I looked a composite after composite and saw "men" who had been my boyhood heroes in one way or another--Jay Guest, the Steely brothers, Jeff Jeffus, Tim White, Billy Hargis and the list goes on.

During my pledgeship, which included five Paris "rookies" and at least that many actives, I thought they should rename the fraternity Delta Tau Paris. (I think they might have considered it but I couldn't come up with appropriate Greek letter!) I only regret that I had to pledge as a junior after transferring from a junior college.

But what did Delta Tau Delta do for me? Grades. Survival. Humility. Pride. Marriage to a Delt Queen.

I never liked studying, but my big brother Mark Ingraham insisted and threatened that I spend every available hour at the House studying. And that's exactly what I did. My grades as a pledge were just good enough to get me initiated. I eventually used that semester as a springboard for the next five to follow. I happily graduated East Texas on the Dean's List.

Despite the stacked odds against Epsilon Eta the members who stayed during the 1976 to 1977 period were simply trying to survive. We faced having to leave campus housing, the decline of our Greek system, a new advisor, less than 10 actives and only 4 pledges. I've never felt a bigger boost than when I shook hands with our national president at the 25th year anniversary just after he assured us that our charter would not be yanked. (and Father "Tex" McElyer was just as happy too)

I had pride in the university, in my goal of a quality education and in being a Delt. The first item on my wall at my first job after graduation was my membership certificate of Delta Tau Delta. And in each subsequent job change the same held true. Being a Greek in itself has opened up new doors and acquaintances for me. The "slim" years instilled an even greater pride in the excellence the undergraduate chapter has held and continued. I still remember a particular Saturday at a well known Dallas hotel when a dozen undergrads wondered why a bunch of "has-beens" would be at a regional conference just for lunch. Pride was the reason we were there to see then President Patrick McGuffey accept Epsilon Eta's second Hugh Shields award.

On October 17,1975 ACU was scheduled to play ETSU. As pledges we had to attend all the home games. I had been home all weekend and returned with my best friend to view the Christians vs. the Lions and to be seen by a couple of actives for brownie points. Little that I know that that the cute, long- haired brunette that began talking to my buddy would soon be paired off with me before the half concluded! Chemistry, not the kind taught by Dr. Williams or Dr. Wilson, was right and now gets credit for our 14-year friendship, and 10 1/2 years of marriage. Plus, I get credit for the 1977 Delt Queen.

You know maybe I can imagine what it would be like to be a college student without being a Delt, but why would I want to lull me and you to sleep?
